

Objectives

 - Data sources (CHSSN Data Model)
 - Statistics Canada, 2011 (100% sample)*
 - Statistics Canada, 1996 (20% sample)

* Caution must be exercised in the interpretation of comparative data (1996 and 2011) due to two different sampling and data collection methodologies used by Statistics Canada.



Québec, 2011



Change in Size of the FOLS-English Population by Age Group, Québec, 1996-2011



Change in Size of the FOLS-English and FOLS-French Population by Age Group , Québec , 1996-2011



Size of the FOLS-English Population by Health Region, Québec 2011





Proportion of the FOLS-English and FOLS-French Population 0-19 years of age by Health Region, Québec 2011



Change in Size of the 0-19 years FOLS-English and FOLS-French Population by Health Region, Québec 1996-2011



Proportion of the FOLS-English and FOLS-French Population 65+ years of age by Health Region, Québec 2011



Change in Size of the FOLS-English and FOLS-French Population 65+ years of age by Health Region, Québec 1996-2011



Proportion of the FOLS-English and FOLS-French Populations 85+ years of age in the Montréal Health Region, Québec 2011


